HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

3.1 (c)(2) Maintenance and replacement of surfaces. All surfaces must be maintained on a regular basis. Surfaces of housing facilities--including houses, dens, and other furniture-type fixtures and objects within the facility--that cannot be readily cleaned and sanitized, must be replaced when worn or soiled

* The doorframes on 2 of the shelter structures containing 6 dogs are excessively chewed exposing bare, splintered wood. These surfaces are worn and cannot be readily cleaned and sanitized. The licensee must repair or replace all areas of chewed, bare wood and thus are no longer impervious to moisture and thus cannot be properly cleaned and sanitized. The licensee must repair or replace these areas of worn wood to allow for proper sanitization.

3.6(a)(2)(xi) Provide sufficient space to allow each dog and cat to turn about freely, to stand, sit, and lie in a comfortable, normal position, and to walk in a normal manner; and

** The primary enclosures for 6 dogs were not of sufficient size to allow the dog to turn about freely, to stand, sit, and lie in a comfortable, normal position, and to walk in a normal manner. Licensee must ensure that all primary enclosures have sufficient space to allow each dog to turn about freely, to stand, sit, and lie in a comfortable, normal position, and to walk in a normal manner.

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3.11 (a) (2) REPEAT

CLEANING, SANITIZATION, HOUSEKEEPING, AND PEST CONTROL.

3.11 (a)(2) Used primary enclosures and food and water receptacles for dogs and cats must be sanitized at least once every 2 weeks using one of the methods prescribed in paragraph (b)(3) of this section, and more often if necessary to prevent an accumulation of dirt, debris, food waste, excreta, and other disease hazards.

* 2 enclosures housing a total of 7 dogs had an accumulation of hay, dirt, grime and food debris. This accumulation prevents the required sanitization to protect the health and well being of the dogs. Licensee must ensure that all primary enclosures are cleaned and sanitized at least once every 2 weeks and more often if needed to prevent an accumulation of dirt, debris, food waste that promote disease hazards.

* The facility does not have a Program of Veterinary Care (Form 7002). The facility must employ a consulting veterinarian. The formal arrangements shall include a written program of veterinary care and regularly scheduled visits to the premises of the dealer or exhibitor.

* "Elisha" a female adult Shar-pei had what appeared to be a red right eye. There was a green mucoid discharge from the eye. The eyeball itself was not visible. The licensee stated that " she was not sure that is had an eye". This dog was also non-weight bearing on the front left leg. The licensee stated that she had gotten into a fight with the black female shar-pei yesterday prior to being separated. Any sick or injured animal must be examined by a licensed veterinarian and health records must be maintained. This dog must be examined by a veterinarian within the next 48 hours and treatment administered as appropriate. Documentation must be maintained for any health related problem that includes the following information:

- Identity of the animal.
- Descriptions of the illness or injury
- Dates, details, and results of examinations, tests, and other such procedures.
- Dates and other details of all treatments, including the name, dose, route, frequency, and duration of treatment with drugs or other medications

3.1 (c) (3) Cleaning. Hard surfaces with which the dogs or cats come in contact must be spot-cleaned daily and

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sanitized in accordance with Sec. 3.11(b) of this subpart to prevent accumulation of excreta and reduce disease hazards. Floors made of dirt, absorbent bedding, sand, gravel, grass, or other similar material must be raked or spot-cleaned with sufficient frequency to ensure all animals the freedom to avoid contact with excreta. Contaminated material must be replaced whenever this raking and spot-cleaning is not sufficient to prevent or eliminate odors, insects, pests, or vermin infestation. All other surfaces of housing facilities must be cleaned and sanitized when necessary to satisfy generally accepted husbandry standards and practices. Sanitization may be done using any of the methods provided in Sec. 3.11(b)(3) for primary enclosures

* At time of inspection the small building had approximately 18 enclosures containing 30-38 dogs that had an accumulation of hair, dirt and grime on the walls and around the base of the enclosure. * Licensee must ensure that all hard surfaces that come in contact with the dogs must be spot-cleaned daily and sanitized to prevent accumulation of buildup of excreta, grime, hair and dirt to reduce disease hazards and allow for through sanitization.

OUTDOOR HOUSING FACILITIES.

DOGHOUSE- INADEQUATE PROTECTION FROM SUN AND RAIN- OUTDOOR FACILITY - 3.4(b)(3) Be provided with a wind break and rain break at the entrance.

* 8 enclosures (4 doghouses and 4 rabbit-style hutches) containing: 2 Mastiffs, 3 Shar-pei, 2 Samoyed Huskies, 2 Wheaton terriers, and 8 Bichons did not have a wind and rain break at the entrance. Licensee must ensure that shelters in outdoor facilities for dogs must be provided with a wind break and rain break at the entrance.

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

HEAD HEIGHT TOO LOW- 3.6(c) (1) (iii) The interior height of a primary enclosure must be at least 6 inches higher than the head of the tallest dog in the enclosure when it is in a normal standing position: Provided That, prior to February 15, 1994, each dog must be able to stand in a comfortable normal position.

* 1 adult cavalier spanial had approximately 1 inch of additional head room in the wire enclosure. The licensee must ensure that there is at least 6 inches of head room above the head of the tallest dog in the enclosure when it is in a normal standing position.
