** The records show that 16 dogs were euthanized in the year of 2006. The owner stated that some of the dogs were euthanized by the veterinarian. All dogs should be euthanized in a humane manner in accordance to AVMA guidelines, gun shot is not an approved method of routine euthanasia except in emergency situations. 3.1 (a)

HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

(a) Structure; construction. Housing facilities for dogs and cats must be designed and constructed so that they are structurally sound. They must be kept in good repair, and they must protect the animals from injury, contain the animals securely, and restrict other animals from entering.

** One pen has openings in the front panel that allows for the dog to stick its head through the openings. The panel needs to be modified or replaced to eliminate the possibility of entrapment. All enclosures must protect the animals from injury and contain the animals securely. (Affects 1 dog) To be corrected by: 04-30-07.

3.4 (c)

OUTDOOR HOUSING FACILITIES.

(c) Construction. Building surfaces in contact with animals in outdoor housing facilities must be impervious to moisture.

** The outdoor enclosures need to have the surfaces treated so as to be impervious to moisture. The wood is worn/weathered and no longer impervious to moisture. All surfaces in contact with the animals must be impervious to

3.6 (c) (1) (iii)

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

(iii) The interior height of a primary enclosure must be at least 6 inches higher than the head of the tallest dog in the enclosure when it is in a normal standing position: Provided That, prior to February 15, 1994, each dog must be able to stand in a comfortable normal position.

** One enclosure inside containing one dog does not provide 6 inches of head space. All enclosures must be at least 6 inches higher than the dogs head housed in the enclosures. To be corrected by: 03-30-07

3.11 (b) (2)

CLEANING, SANITIZATION, HOUSEKEEPING, AND PEST CONTROL.

(2) Used primary enclosures and food and water receptacles for dogs and cats must be sanitized at least once every 2 weeks using one of the methods prescribed in paragraph (b)(3) of this section, and more often if necessary to prevent an accumulation of dirt, debris, food waste, excreta, and other disease hazards.

** The outside enclosures need to be sanitized to remove an accumulation of dirt, oils, excreta, etc... All enclosures must be sanitized at least every 2 weeks and more often if necessary to prevent an accumulation of dirt, oils, excreta, etc... (Affects approx 20 animals) To be corrected by: 04-15-07.
